From the Pastor's Desk

HE IS RISEN INDEED!!!

"Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said (Matthew 28:5-6)

Many attempts have been made to debunk the resurrection of Jesus from the very time of His rising from the dead. But the following irrefutable facts can be put forth in defense of His Resurrection.

1. Jesus' body was missing. If the Jews could have found it, they could have stilled the preaching of Jesus' resurrection that filled Jerusalem. But they could not.
2. The body wasn't stolen. The Romans had no motive. The Jews had no motive. Ah-ha, you say, The disciples stole it. There is the matter of the Roman guards, and the disciples' initial disbelief when the women brought them the news early that Easter morning. This brings me to my third point.
3. If the disciples had stolen the body, you wouldn't expect them to risk their lives. People don't die for what they know is not true. But the disciples put their lives on the line, and nearly all were eventually martyred for their faith. They certainly believed it.
4. The church mushroomed size in Jerusalem, the very place he was crucified. Followers of Jesus in the city of Jerusalem grew from a few dozen to thousands upon thousands soon after Jesus' resurrection. They believed it was true.
5. Contemporary documents refer to the event. Thallus the Samaritan, Suetonius, Tacitus, Pliny contain references to Jesus. Jewish historian Josephus writes about Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. They knew something had happened.

Tomb, thou shalt not hold Him longer.

Death is strong, but life is stronger.

Stronger than the dark, the light.

Stronger than the wrong, the right...

- Phillips Brooks, "An Easter Carol"

Jesus' resurrection from the dead is actually more plausible than any other explanation. Christ's death and resurrection is the foundation of the Christian Faith. That's why we celebrate. This is the most joyous feast of the year. The church is now filled with the spirit of Jesus and with His Light. It is no longer silent as we join our songs of praise with the choirs in heaven. We are reminded of Christ's promise "I will give you a joy which no one will take from you." (John 16:22). Easter is the beginning of our new life with Christ.

Jesus' resurrection means that death is not the end. That though my body may lie rotting in the ground, Jesus whom the Father raised from the death, gives me eternal life. Ultimately, we Christians believe, our bodies, too, will be raised from the death.

What do we Christians say in the face of death? There are many mysteries. But two things we know for sure. First, death is an enemy. But second, and more important, Jesus' resurrection from the grave is God's proof to us that death is not the end. The empty tomb and Jesus' Spirit within us testify that Easter morning is God's triumph over death. And ultimately, Jesus promised, God will raise from the dead all who believe in His Son. "I am the resurrection and the life." Jesus said "He who believes in me will live, even though he dies, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die."

And since Jesus is not dead, people can encounter him today. You can know him through a personal relationship. I could point to several people who can testify what Jesus has done in their lives to bring them from the brink of disaster to peace and meaning and joy. People who have encountered Him at a retreat and or at a healing service and were able to battle the demons of their lives and conquer them with His help. He changes people for good. While some leaders reform. ONLY JESUS TRANSFORMS.

Christ's resurrection brings him into new life and promises the same for us. Not just eternal life, although that's part of it, but genuinely new life. Change is hard, as so many people tell me and as I know myself. Left to our own devices, we'd probably just settle for an improved version of our present life. In the words of Floyd W. Tomkins, "Let the resurrection joy lift us from loneliness and weakness and despair to strength and beauty and happiness." –

For while religious leaders have come and gone, the fact remains: only One stepped forth from the tomb. Only One has risen from the dead. Only One has conquered death. Only One offers the promise of eternal life to those who follow him.

Alleluia! He is risen!

LITURGY MINISTRY COURSES CONDUCTED BY THE ARCHDIOCESE OF BOMBAY

The Archdiocese Commission for Liturgy among other functions conducts basic and advance Liturgy courses for laity. Liturgy as we understand today is encounter and action; the action of Christians who belong to a community of believers in carrying out the work of God. The course contents deal with the various dimensions of the liturgy and the study reveal the depth of the various actions undertaken in liturgy. Being community centred, all those who assist in making the liturgy meaningful collaborate towards proper fulfilment of the liturgy, which includes the Sacristan, Altar-servers, Commentator, Cantor and/or choir, Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Eucharist among so many others.

In view of the pandemic, the Liturgy office conducted online sessions for both the Basic as also the Advanced Liturgy Courses consecutively in the years 2021 and 2022. The Professors who were hand-picked for conducting the twelve sessions (2 per month), per course, were an authority on the subject matter, and it is a matter of pride that our Archdiocese boasts of so many talented Priests. Equally talented were the three women Professors which included a Religious Sister.

The program was seen to have both its own advantages and disadvantages. The disadvantages being the Resource persons were not able to relate to participants as in an in-person atmosphere. However it was felt that the advantages were many first being that 61 participants (a bumper crop as per Fr. Savio de Sales, Secretary, Commission for Liturgy!) completed the Basic course against a restricted number traditionally. Besides the ones from Bombay Diocese, there were a couple of them from outside Mumbai and also one from outside the country!! All the Professors ensured that we remained awake and attentive throughout the sessions by making the sessions as interactive as possible. The only challenge for the participants was announcement of assignments after every session with a fairly strict deadline for submission of the assignments. This made us scan many documents of the Church like

Scrosanctum Consillium, Dies Domini, Scramentum Cariatis, Musicam Sacrum, Catechism of the Catholic Church to name a few.

It was an enriching experience for all the participants. The culmination of the course was the Graduation Day at the Pauline Media Centre, Bandra. A beautiful and meaningful prayer service was put together by the Liturgy office where all the participants of the course were involved. Keynote address on Liturgy and Youth with a modern outlook of Liturgy was delivered by Sr. Joeyanna D'Souza, FSP during the graduation of the Basic course in March 2022 and keynote address in the year 2023 was delivered by Fr. Luke Rodrigues SJ, on a very relevant topic Liturgy and Ecology.

Bishop John Rodrigues, in-Charge of the Commission for Liturgy did the honours of presenting the certificates and the Score card!!

Having successfully completed both the courses I feel I have become rich, rather richer in my understanding of Liturgy. As St. Paul says in 1 Corinthians, Ch.2, v.9 – What no eye has seen, nor ear heard nor the human heart conceived what God has prepared for those who love him. This sums up my experience at the Liturgy courses. I was washed clean in my mind about the correct understanding of the richness in Liturgy. The church in all her wisdom guided by the Holy Spirit brings us so near to the Father through Jesus. I remain in awe at every mass that I now attend. I am now able to immerse myself into the depth of the Liturgy of the Word which is so so rich. I am now aware that during the Liturgy of the Eucharist that Heaven joins the Earth in the moments of timelessness. The Liturgy that is celebrated at the Altar is the foretaste of the Liturgy which is being celebrated in Heaven.

In conclusion, I'd like to encourage many more to undertake the Liturgy Courses and partake in the enrichment and experience the unique beauty and meaning of the Liturgy

All of you will be delighted to know that on the occasion of Women's day this year, Mrs. Alexandrina Barreto Xavier Aiyar, our parishioner was specially honoured with "THE NARI SAMMAN PURASKAR", an award for her selfless service rendered to society at large and N. Dutta Marg in particular. The award was presented by our respected M.L.A Shri Ameet Satam. This is but one of the recognition conferred on her and on the N. Dutta Marg ALM over the last several years.

I have known Mrs. Aiyar closely for over twenty years. Both of us reside on N. Dutta Marg.

She took voluntary retirement in 1998, as Senior Manager, State Bank of India, after 35 years of service. Previously, she was employed with Banco Nacional Ultramarino, Goa till its merger with State Bank of India, after liberation in December 1961.

She always had a passion for social work. Her long stint with SBI where she worked with people of all communities imbued her with an innate sense of secularism. She was determined to do social work for the community at large and not any particular segment.

GREEN CELL- CARE FOR CREATION



The effects of climate change are hazardous and are affecting every aspect of life be it human, marine, flora and fauna.

One needs to be the change to bring about any kind of change.

I firmly believe; when two or more persons are involved in a common goal, the results are accomplished faster. The word TEAM for me is - ‘Together Everyone Achieves More’.

Keeping the above in mind the ‘Green Cell Team’ of Good Shepherd Parish was formed in November 2021 under the guidance of Fr. Anil Rego. Our team of 7 aim in caring for nature, contributing towards the environment and reducing carbon emissions.

After brain storming, it was decided to first focus on 3 areas- recycling of plastic, e-waste and wet waste composting. The team has initiated recycling of plastic and e waste. Bins are marked for placing plastic and e waste for recycling in the parish premises. The parish is registered with Bisleri which carries out the pick up every Friday. From July 2022 till date the parish has recycled 174 kilos of plastic. E waste recycling is carried out by Eco Reco and is done on a monthly basis.

We also initiated wet waste composting for the parish. The staff at the parish were educated on the items that need to be kept aside for converting wet waste into manure. A separate bin for composting is placed near the grotto. The converted manure is used as a fertilizer for the various plants within the church premises.



You will agree that anything to do with climate change, environment related is an ongoing process and will always remain ongoing.

The upcoming tasks that will be undertaken are the wet waste composting workshop for the parishioners which is scheduled on 26th March 2023. We will also be rolling the concept of recycling and using eco-friendly products across the parish communities, neighbourhood, individual societies so on and so forth.

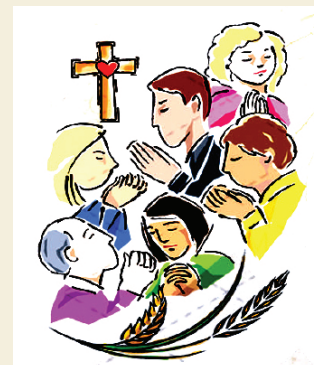
