From the Pastor's Desk

HE IS RISEN INDEED!!!

"Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said (Matthew 28:5-6)

Many attempts have been made to debunk the resurrection of Jesus from the very time of His rising from the dead. But the following irrefutable facts can be put forth in defense of His Resurrection.

1. Jesus' body was missing. If the Jews could have found it, they could have stilled the preaching of Jesus' resurrection that filled Jerusalem. But they could not.
2. The body wasn't stolen. The Romans had no motive. The Jews had no motive. Ah-ha, you say, The disciples stole it. There is the matter of the Roman guards, and the disciples' initial disbelief when the women brought them the news early that Easter morning. This brings me to my third point.
3. If the disciples had stolen the body, you wouldn't expect them to risk their lives. People don't die for what they know is not true. But the disciples put their lives on the line, and nearly all were eventually martyred for their faith. They certainly believed it.
4. The church mushroomed size in Jerusalem, the very place he was crucified. Followers of Jesus in the city of Jerusalem grew from a few dozen to thousands upon thousands soon after Jesus' resurrection. They believed it was true.
5. Contemporary documents refer to the event. Thallus the Samaritan, Suetonius, Tacitus, Pliny contain references to Jesus. Jewish historian Josephus writes about Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. They knew something had happened.

Tomb, thou shalt not hold Him longer.

Death is strong, but life is stronger.

Stronger than the dark, the light.

Stronger than the wrong, the right...

Jesus' resurrection from the dead is actually more plausible than any other explanation. Christ's death and resurrection is the foundation of the Christian Faith. That's why we celebrate. This is the most joyous feast of the year. The church is now filled with the spirit of Jesus and with His Light. It is no longer silent as we join our songs of praise with the choirs in heaven. We are reminded of Christ's promise "I will give you a joy which no one will take from you." (John 16:22). Easter is the beginning of our new life with Christ.

Jesus' resurrection means that death is not the end. That though my body may lie

rotting in the ground, Jesus whom the Father raised from the death, gives me eternal life. Ultimately, we Christians believe, our bodies, too, will be raised from the death.

What do we Christians say in the face of death? There are many mysteries. But two things we know for sure. First, death is an enemy. But second, and more important, Jesus' resurrection from the grave is God's proof to us that death is not the end. The empty tomb and Jesus' Spirit within us testify that Easter morning is God's triumph over death. And ultimately, Jesus promised, God will raise from the dead all who believe in His Son. "I am the resurrection and the life." Jesus said "He who believes in me will live, even though he dies, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die."

And since Jesus is not dead, people can encounter him today. You can know him through a personal relationship. I could point to several people who can testify what Jesus has done in their lives to bring them from the brink of disaster to peace and meaning and joy. People who have encountered Him at a retreat and or at a healing service and were able to battle the demons of their lives and conquer them with His help. He changes people for good. While some leaders reform. ONLY JESUS TRANSFORMS.

Christ's resurrection brings him into new life and promises the same for us. Not just eternal life, although that's part of it, but genuinely new life. Change is hard, as so many people tell me and as I know myself. Left to our own devices, we'd probably just settle for an improved version of our present life. In the words of Floyd W. Tomkins, "Let the resurrection joy lift us from loneliness and weakness and despair to strength and beauty and happiness." -

For while religious leaders have come and gone, the fact remains: only One stepped forth from the tomb. Only One has risen from the dead. Only One has conquered death. Only One offers the promise of eternal life to those who follow him.

Alleluia! He is risen!

PARISH CRIB & STAR

After a long pause due to global restrictions, we finally got a chance to channelize our creativity through the crib and we, as great opportunists would, didn't want to miss this chance.

We would like to take a moment to appreciate the

work of all the youth who helped in making the crib and the star. We were all fueled up and ready to give it our all, in spite of our busy schedules.

We dedicated our time, efforts and energy into this project. While the animators were guiding and



explaining how to go about creating the different elements, we kept innovating along the way.

The animators were very supportive throughout.

Everyone had different role to play in the making of the crib and star. I think we all did a fantastic job in recognizing what we were good at and different tasks were assigned accordingly.

The ideas of the young and inputs of the wise really made it all remarkable.

It was all due to diversity of ideas and capabilities that we created an amazing piece of art.

It was entralling to see everyone excited about the end result and it was equally fascinating for us to see the reactions after the first reveal.

The Parishioners were impressed and appreciated us for the theme and aura around the crib.

Everyone of us was happy after doing tremendous and countless work hours on the crib and star.

We were all really glad that the details which we mainly worked on were noticed and liked by our Parishioners.

Let us brief you all incase you missed the significance of the elements.

The background is inspired by 'Mandala' which is the Sanskrit for 'circle' or 'completion' which also represents the blessed host. The four doves on the wheel of time is a representation of the four corners of the Earth and the Holy Trinity which adds up to number 7. Wheel of time ultimately means that life will keep revolving and flow in a series. 7 is a complete number in the scripture, keeping that in mind was the idea behind the 7 spokes in the wheel. The 7 feathers on each side of the spectrum in the backdrop are of the reference of angels. The 7 lamps symbolically were taken from the following reference: Psalm 119:105 - "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and light unto my path." Wood is

an element which has extensively been used, as Jesus was into carpentry profession. Ship is a medium of travelling from one coast to another wherein we see Jesus get into the ship to move from one countryside to another. The Eagle on the Ship represents one of the four creatures symbolic of the evangelists. Baby Jesus being placed on the wood of the Alpha and the Omega simply means He is the Beginning and the End. Lastly speaking of the backdrop inclusive of the colour of the third candle of advent- pink, which itself is a colour of joy and rejoicing, the theme white and yellow symbolize purity, peace, positivity and hope.

After we were all done with the individual piece of work, it was show time and everything blended together, we had fun times, lots of learnings and memories, and everything together precisely complimented beautifully.

STAR AND CRIB COMPETITION

As the season of advent was approaching, a time to rejoice, wanting to keep the spirit of Christmas alive and kicking, Good Shepherd Parish conducted a STAR and CRIB competition for the parishioners. 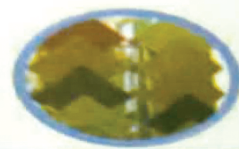

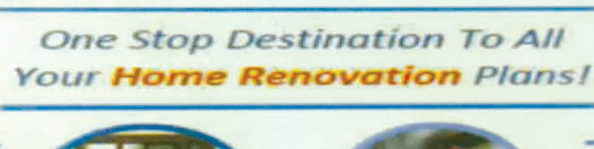

The immediate neighbour of the Good Shepherd Church is the Good Shepherd Convent. Many of us may not be aware that Good Shepherd Convent exists and has been functioning silently since 1968.

'The journey of a thousand miles begins with One Step'. This first step was taken by their foundress Sr. Mary Euphrasia. The present superior of the Convent is Sr. Mary Jose who is a very active and dynamic personality. Over the years they have grown slowly but surely.

The primary aim of the Convent is to cater to the marginalised and vulnerable. Their work can be vividly seen through the number of activities listed below:

1. Run a Hostel for the low income working Spinsters up to 35 years of age.
2. Coaching class for under privileged students of Stds I – X
3. Computer and Sewing classes with minimum fees.
4. At intervals they conduct Free Health Eye & Dental camps for the less fortunate.
5. Crisis Centre for Women in Distress.
 - The sisters counsel these women, try to help them, solve their problems and also provide a short stay till their family disputes are minimised.
6. Cater to the Spiritual Growth of the Migrant Workers.

7. Sponsorship Programme to finance the education of the economically backward class.

This immense work of charity is possible due to God's Divine Providence together with some generous donors.

Some parishioners called Lay Mission Partners render voluntary service in the various activities. As the Social activist Bernice Johnson Reagan puts it –

'Life's challenges are not supposed to paralyse you. They are supposed to help you discover who you are' This is exactly what is done at the Good Shepherd Convent.

Their Yeoman Service could be visualised during the pandemic when they distributed Ration & Food stuff to the needy with patience, sacrifice and love. The fruits of their labour comes from the depths of their silence.

I have been associated with the Good Shepherd Sisters for almost two decades and is a witness to their tireless efforts, striving to bring a Ray of Hope to the Hopeless.

May they journey forward and continue to be Barrels of God's Flame and Light.

Working Parents voice for a New Employer Value Proposition

McKinsey research finds working parents are more likely to have left their jobs during the past 2 years than their non-parent colleagues. Reasons include exhaustion from the pressures of working from home and balancing childcare responsibilities, struggles with resuming office but lack of effective and efficient childcare facilities, and re-evaluating their overall work-life balance. 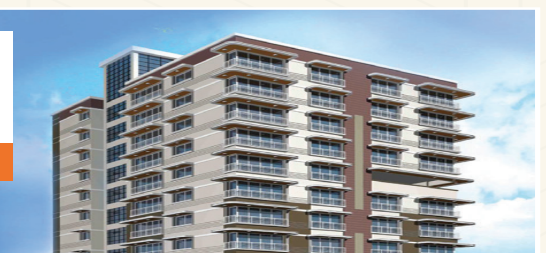
