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PUTTING CHRIST BACK INTO CHRISTMAS

Some years back, in the first year of my priesthood, on my visit home, my Mum handed me a package. The package contained the old statues of our family crib.

She told me to give it to some poor parishioner who would find good use for it.

When I reached my room in the parish, I opened the package and all the statues of shepherds, sheep, camel, kings, angel, Joseph, Mary & the child Jesus tumbled out. And with it, memories of the many Christmases spent at home flooded my mind in a flash. Memories of bringing out the statues from the loft, wiping the statues together and setting up the crib together on Christmas eve every year. Not to forget praying before the crib as one family every morning & night before going to bed during the Christmas octave.

Those were the days when, with all the trappings of Christmas, Christ was most central to the season. I must confess that I just was not ready to part with the statues that embodied the very best memories of Christmas. I was tempted to retain them and make a crib in my room with them. But constraints for space in my room compelled me to retain only the child Jesus, which I kept in a prominent place in my room and prayed before it in the morning & night without fail during the Christmas octave, in keeping with my family tradition. It is something that I follow religiously every Christmas.

When I became Principal of a school, in my interaction with the juniors at school, I would ask them as Christmas approaches, what Christmas means to them. And invariably the responses were (surprisingly from even a few catholic kids as well): 'Santa Claus, Snow men, gifts, parties, sweets,'...etc. Where is the Christ child???? - THE REAL REASON FOR THE SEASON. These children of course cannot be blamed for such a perception. Because these are the motifs that are dominantly prevalent all around them... in the malls, shops and at all parties & Christmas galas.

The time is come for us Christians to start a concerted campaign to put Christ back into Christmas against the onslaught of the campaign of the business and the commercial world that seeks only to derive maximum profit from the season.

HOW TO PUT CHRIST BACK INTO CHRISTMAS (some practical steps):

- 1. BUYING CHRISTMAS CARDS ONLY WITH THE CHRIST CHILD OR NATIVITY SCENE AS THE THEME: You will notice that most of the cards sold before Christmas in the stores are with motifs that are far removed from the Christ child – Santa Claus, Christmas Trees, bells, snowmen, candles, sceneries of snow, etc. You have to literally go searching for a card that has the theme of Christ. As Christians when we shop for cards, we could insist that we buy only cards that depict the Nativity scene. This will force the distributors to convey this to the suppliers who in turn will be compelled to settle for a change in emphasis.
- 2. PUT UP A CRIB IN A PROMINENT PLACE IN THE HOUSE: While the trend today is to give the Christmas tree a prominent place in the House, it would be only proper if this place was given to the crib. The crib should be the focal point during the Christmas season and also the focus of all our devotions & prayers during the season.
- 3. PUT UP A STAR (WITH A CHRISTIAN THEME) & A CRIB IN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD: This

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is a powerful way of sharing the true message of Christmas with our brothers & sister of other faiths. At the Parish – level an inter-community star & crib competition could be held to foster this.

- 4. REVIVE THE GOOD TRADITION OF GOING ROUND CAROLING: This again can be organized at the small Christian community level where each community organizes a group and covers the areas in their respective localities. Once again the carols should be Christcentric and the true message of Christmas could be conveyed in creative ways e.g. with a live tableau accompanying the carols or placards with meaningful messages.
- 5. READ THE BIBLE (LUKE CH.2): The Infancy narrative on Christmas eve & on Christmas day. Read it out loud to your entire family. Have everybody REFLECT ON what was read. And pray over it.
- 6. GIVE GIFTS: to the needy, and be charitable to other people. Do this in the gift giving spirit OF GOD WHO GAVE HIS ONLY SON AT CHRISTMAS and as the 3 kings set for our example.
- 7. Be sure to sing Christ orientated songs and play Christian Christmas CDs. Leave out the silly Christmas songs and listen to songs about Jesus Christ & his birth. Let us all resolve to make CHRIST THE CENTRAL FOCUS in our celebration of Christmas this year. While we may indulge in all the other frills that go with the season, may we never lose sight of the real focus i.e. the Christ child. The true presence of Christmas is found in Jesus. Let the celebration of His birth touch our hearts in a new way this year.

Finally I would like to conclude with the words of a song 'Let's Put Christ Back Into Christmas (This Year)' by Tammy Wynette:

Unto you is born this day a Saviour A baby boy was found there in a manger The blessed truth of Christmas let us hear Let's put Christ back into Christmas this year

> Christmas is the birthday of our King The greatest gift of all he came to bring He's the Prince of Peace, let's show him that we care Let's put Christ back into Christmas this year

BLESSING OF THE CRIB

This blessing of the Christmas Crib is for use in the home, prayed by the family members over the Crib. Suggested use Christmas Eve or Christmas Day, before opening the gifts.

ENTRANCE HYMN: O Come All Ye Faithful" or "Silent Night."

FIRST READING: The mother of the family reads:

The eternal Son of God having become man out of love for us, chose to be born in a lowly stable, rather than in the greatest palace of kings. Being rich, He became poor for our sake to show us how greatly He loves poverty and humility. But the presence of the King of kings made this lowly shelter to be the most honorable and noble of royal palaces. Herein He was pleased to be, adored by His virgin mother and father, by the poor shepherds, and by the wealthy wise men. As a man among men Christ came for all men, of all times, and all places; unless we say "there is no room," He will come into our home this Christmas night, and will make it a place of splendor, of love and of great joy.

All answer: Thanks be to God. Mother: The Word was made flesh, Alleluia.

All: And dwells among us, Alleluia.

SECOND READING

One of the children reads: From the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke:



At that time the shepherds were saying to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this event that has come to pass which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste, and

found Mary and Joseph, and the Babe lying in the manger. And when they had seen, they understood what had been told them concerning this child. And all who heard marveled at the things told them by the shepherds. But Mary kept in mind all these words pondering them in her heart. And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, even as it was spoken to them. Each member of the family kisses the Gospel text.


FINAL PRAYER

FAMILY CELL

"DEVELOPING ENABLING RELATIONSHIP WITHIN THE FAMILY"

The Family Cell of our Good Shepherd parish in coordination with the Andheri Deanery organized a session on 4th Dec '21 on "Developing enabling relationship within the family". This session was conducted on zoom and open to all families.

This session was given by Marietta Monteiro from our Parish. Marietta is a counsellor, she and her husband Malcolm are actively involved with the Marriage Encounter program. Marietta has been a counsellor with two international schools for 10 years.

This topic was chosen considering the diverse challenges facing everyone withinour families - like internal conflicts, fear and the loss of a hopeful future, the lack of sharing and caring for one another, the inability to pray together and understand each other, leading to difficulties in accepting and loving each other within the family and home.

The session started with an opening prayer and introduction of Marietta to all. Marietta started by reminding us of how simple life can be if we stay simple and humble, how in a good family, values of

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love, forgiveness, sharing and caring are imparted by parents to children, how these values can be practiced all the time by living a life of love, by making "love a decision and not just a feeling"

She made us aware of how our natural responses to the members of our family can affect our relationships, the need to think, pause and choose the way we respond. The importanceand the manner of communicating mutually, with love, within the family rather than seeking support by complaining to outsiders.

By giving simple examples Marietta showed us the impact "words" can have in our lives, how our words can leave lasting impressions, how they can repair relationships, acknowledge the other, express humility and forgiveness where and when in matters most, how all these require us to seek God and His grace in our life.

Marietta spoke how couples, within the sacrament of marriage today, find it difficult to live their vocation of love due to petty reasons, putting their individual pride and ego above their love and commitment to each other, how very often it is important to look inwards, to forgive each other and renew our love as husband and wife. The importance to act out our love towards our children rather than just speaking words.

Marietta explained with a short story how the Eucharistis the source of strength and the Rosary are

very essential family prayers. The wonderful presence of Jesus himself in the Eucharist, the importance of preparing ourselves before Mass and giving Jesus the top place within our lives and homes. She also explained how each one of us can pray "without ceasing" by praying "within the context of our lives" In the context of the pandemic, Marietta made us aware of the need to understand and share our resources with the helpless and the needy, by putting our feet in the shoes that bite. The need to be humble and thankful to God for the blessings and comforts he has given us in our homes, remembering that we "own nothing" but everything we have is given to us by God, we are only stewards. The awareness of others, the pandemic has brought in our lives and ask what we are doing about this.

In understanding one another, we look for each other's strengths not weaknesses, knowing that we do not "own anyone" but God has placed us on earth to enjoy each other's love, work with patience and enjoy our earthly relationships,

In sharing her testimony, Marietta told us how powerfully Mother Mary worked in her life and that none of us must ever give up praying. She shared her profound heartfelt experience while working with St. Mother Teresa in Calcutta, how the strength and dedication of Mother Teresa came from her "seeing Jesus" in each human being she served in her missionary journey.

She also explained the importance of sharing the work at home, of caring for our neighbours and community, of expressing our appreciation of others and of keeping our neighbourhood clean and green.

It was indeed a learning experience, of looking within ourselves deeply, enabling us to look outwards into each other with hearts of love and service, understanding and sharing and caring, seeing Jesus and seeking his grace and strength in developing enabling relationships within our families, and within our communities.

"AUTHENTIC DEVOTION TO THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, OUR MOTHER AND MODEL"

October being the month dedicated to Mary our Mother, the Family Cell of our Parish arranged a talk on the above theme on zoom. This talk was given by the charismatic and enthusiastic preacher Francis D'Souza, well known for his teaching and preaching, in India and countries abroad for more than 40 years. We started with an opening prayer by Ignatius and Natty Pereira of our family cell.

The talk on the rightly ordered devotion to Mary was based on "Marialis Cultus", the apostolic exhortation of Pope Paul VI. Francis explained in depth and clarity, these four Marian Dogmas, which we use so often in our Marian devotion.

Mary, is the "Mother of God" because of the two natures of her son Jesus Christ – true God and true Man, which Jesus never gave up since His Incarnation. It is because of this, that we stay confident that Jesus understands our human weaknessand challenges when we pray to Him.

Mary is very unique, God "preserved her virginity" before, during and after the birth of Jesus. This clarified a lot of misconceptions put across, by "non-Catholic" denominations, some even quoting, or better mis-quoting scripture/s, about the brothers and sisters of Jesus and the "perpetual virginity of Mary".

The third dogma that was explained, was Mary's "Immaculate Conception ".It was Almighty God who preserved Mary from the stain of original sin, from her conception in the womb of St. Anne (her mother), preparing in Mary, an un-stained dwelling place for Jesus.

Mary's body was not subject to decay because of her "Assumption to heaven, body and soul", this too has been debated among "non-Catholic" believers over the years, some even claiming the existence of Mary's tomb.

Thanks to Francis, for putting to rest our doubts and misunderstandings, making it possible for us Catholics to appreciate and celebrate more spiritually the Marian devotions and feasts associated with these four dogmas.

He went on to explain how each one of us can imitate Mary by practicing, like Mary, the outstanding virtues of Faith, Hope, Love in service and being courageously open to, and obedient in following the divine will of God. This she did, facing the challenges, all her life from the 'Annunciation' to the foot of the 'Cross'.

At the wedding feast of Cana, we see the Mary's faith in Jesus, when, she said to the servants "do whatever He tells You". We see her loving service in the "Visitation", when she travels through the hill country, to be in loving service of her cousin Elizabeth. We see her hope at the foot of the cross, and before Pentecost.

Before we seek favours from Mother Mary, it is very important to imitate her virtues of Faith, Hope, Loving service and Obedience to God's will.

All devotions to Mary, like Novenas and Rosary, are inspired by the Holy Spirit. Francis explained the importance of praying the Rosary with its mysteries, the Rosary is scriptural and a compendium of the whole Gospel. The Rosary is a prayer of salvation, we take the name of Jesus 53 times. It is also our weapon to fight evil. As family prayer it keeps the family together, a strong family leads to strong society, strong nation and better world

Francis explained how the Word of God strengthens our faith, how the Sacraments edify us and give glory to God, made us aware of the difference between "praying" and 'saying prayers" and how the lack of prayer will lead us astray. As baptized Catholics we are called to be Holy as God is Holy. When we pray and seek the higher and eternal things in life, God takes care even of our material needs. Our lives are two dimensional, vertical towards God and horizontal towards service of others – we need to live in both dimensions to be pleasing to God.

A prayer to Mama Mary in song was played, for her intercession. Francis then prayed for the families, their needs and challenges. The participants could ask questions, seek clarifications and express their feedback on the talk.

On behalf of the Family cell, Nimia D'Costa, thanked our preacher Francis D'Souza, for his enlightening and heartening talk on Mother Mary and devotion to our Mother. Our thanks to Fr. Anil Rego, our Parish Priest, for his encouraging support to our Family cell and it's activities, thanks to Fr. Savio Lobo our Spiritual Director, for his constant guidance, direction and correction to our Family cell, thanks to Fr. James D'Costa and Deacon Inacin for their support and thanks to all of You and your families for actively participating in the program.

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Moving towards a Gig Economy

Every profession & trade knew their individual job role and worked extremely hard to deliver the desired output. In the past decade, there have been major upheavals within the job market. Earlier, a traditional "Job Economy" has slowly and steadily begun evolving to a "Gig Economy". The Job Economy had individuals focusing on a lifetime career, gig economy workers are those who work on a freelance, temporary or need basis. Incidentally, a crisis comes as a blessing in disguise for the gig ecosystem. The model had been around for years, the 2008 financial crisis in the US initiated the first push towards the Gig Ecosystem. As companies focussed on ensuring operations remained smooth, while trimming operational spends, freelance workers showed the way of lowering expenses via a greater cost-benefit ratio. The 2020 coronavirus pandemic has done likewise. Whereas gig work was gradually gathering momentum, COVID-19 compressed the process of years into weeks.

In a gig economy, the job market is marked by dominance of limited-period contracts rather than permanent jobs. So, instead of a regular wage, an individual gets paid for "gigs". Though proponents of the gig economy claim people can benefit from flexible hours, it has its fair share of detractors, who consider it a form of exploitation, with very little workplace protection

Technological advancements have made it possible for people to work remotely and independently while on the move through a cloud platform. The gig economy uses digital platforms to connect freelancers with customers thereby providing short-term services.

As per a BCG report, the gig economy has the potential to service up to 90 million jobs (roughly 30% of India's non-farm workforce), add up to 1.25% to India's GDP and create millions of new jobs across all sectors of India's economy. As per ASSOCHAM, India's gig sector is expected to increase to US\$455 billion at a CAGR of 17% by 2024 and has the potential to expand at least 2x the pre-pandemic estimates.

The future of gig work holds enormous potential because it can be more meaningful and rewarding in more than just the monetary aspect. Its main advantage lies in its integration with technology because, the future of India's start-ups and its gig economy lies in digital innovations. With time, more individuals will move into the gig economy due to benefits such as improved work-life balance and the convenience to work with who you want and when you want and from wherever you want. The evolution of 'Work from Home' to 'Work from Anywhere' is setting the ball rolling. Employees have stayed at their native places and made the most of their isolation with equal balance on productivity and health. The employers, on the other hand, can benefit from the reduced costs of not hiring a long-term employee who may not prove to be the right fit in the long-term and instead of hiring on-demand workforce based on skills for different projects. Undoubtedly, the gig economy is poised for unprecedented growth across specializations and multiple industry verticals.

It all began in 2014, when a group of Catholics in Mumbai came together to create a Centre of Excellence within the Archdiocese of Bombay. They felt that many Catholic youth needed mentors to shine a light on their potential and guide them to achieve more than what they believed was possible to be accomplished. They strongly believed that senior professionals could help bring about changes in the hearts and minds of these youngsters simply by providing them with windows of opportunities.

The program works on the basic premise that every young person is a genius in his or her own unique way and has tremendous potential. The mentor acts like a catalyst and role-model guiding the mentee to the best he/she can.

Take Charge in other words is a one-to-one community based mentoring model with an objective to EMPOWER the Catholic Youth of Mumbai to achieve possibilities way beyond their current aspirations.

The mentors who are carefully chosen for their professional and personal track record of excellence are from diverse fields. They take time out from their busy professional and personal lives to guide the young mentees they have been assigned.

The program eligibility is for Catholic youth from the Archdiocese of Mumbai from ages 16 to 24 years. The shortlisted mentee is paired with a successful mentor. Over a period of 18-24 months, the mentee is regularly in touch with the assigned mentor who acts as a trusted friend, guide and role model. The guidance in largely in the areas of All round personality development, Academics, Skill development and Career choices

From 2015 onwards, Take Charge has had 4 batches and over 500 youth have benefitted from the mentorship program.
