

# RITE OF INITIATION - CONFIRMATION

Each year we have our ellgible youth embark on their journey of the sacrament of Confirmation. Whilst it may seem a routine church activity year after year, very little is known about the efforts that go into preparing a confirmand (candidates being confirmed are known as confirmands).

Hence it is of paramount importance to have an Orientation day which marks a blessing filled beginning of the confirmation journey.

The Orientation Day for the confirmation students was held on June 25th, 2023 in the St Louis Convent school hall. This year we have a batch of 26 confirmands, my son included. In attendance were the Confirmation teachers, the confirmands and their parent/s and most importantly our spiritual director Fr Frankie Crasto.

The event kick-started with a warm welcome and an ice breaker conducted by one of the teachers with a dynamo persona, Amit Furtado. This was much needed

as it brought together eager participants, both-the confirmands and us parents, fostering a sense of community and camaraderie.

With the tempo in relax mode, we were then guided towards listening to the Word of God ,followed by a small spiritual reflection and contemplation conducted by the team of teachers.

We then had the teachers introducing themselves. The confirmation teachers, Belinda Rodrigues, Esther Henriques, Priya Pereira , Subhash Kantaria and Amit Furtado bring with them decades of experience in teaching the faith and imparting spiritual knowledge . Most importantly they have the knowhow in interacting with the teens and keeping them engaged , assuring us that our teens are in safe hands. They shared their personal anecdotes, advice, and wisdom, serving as role models exemplifying the principles of the faith in their daily lives.

We then moved on to a session filled with guidance and insights of the confirmation classes that will be held, setting the tone for the upcoming confirmation journey. A PowerPoint presentation was shown apprising the confirmands of the

dos and don'ts and the code of conduct expected to be followed through the classes tenure. We were also familiarized with the various programs and retreats that are in the pipeline for the year. At this juncture, parents too were apprised what was expected from us , gently reminding us that as parents, we too have a vital role to play in this journey. We then had a casual discussion on the year planner.

The highlight of the day was the Rite of Initiation, led by Fr Frankie who called for a sincere and fervent commitment from the parents and the confirmands. This spiritual activity allowed the confirmands to connect with their inner selves and to grasp the depth of their faith. This moment also provided us an opportunity to spiritually bond with our child and to align our thoughts, emotions, and aspirations with our religious convictions. I would like to express my gratitude to Father Frankie for leading us through this enriching spirit filled time with his expertise and vast experience in the journey of confirmation. My accolades to the confirmation teachers who are an epitome of dedication and commitment.

The beautiful morning ended with the mandatory group picture .

My take away from this Orientationday was a morning filled with an enlightening experience paving a way for us parents to a beautiful Confirmation journey ahead with our confirmands.

#### COMMUNITY WELFARE FUND

The Fifth Precept of the Church teaches that "the faithful have a duty of providing for the material needs of the Church" each according to his/ her abilities (CCC 2043). Therefore, financially supporting the church is a religious obligation that every Catholic has to fulfil irrespective of whether the church is rich or poor.

In the Archdiocese of Bombay, the Church expects every Catholic to support it by contributing only 1% of the total family earning. This 1% income is submitted in the Parish Office in an envelope as the Community Welfare Fund for which a receipt is issued. The amount so collected is utilised to help the poor and needy of the parish in the form of educational aid, medical aid, and other material benefits as and when approved by the CWF Committee. It is expected that every parishioner contributes conscientiously.

#### **Disbursement of Funds**

There are various ways of disbursing or allocating the funds. One suggestions is as follows:-

50% for medical and education for the needy of the parish. The SVP would also draw from this to carry on their activities. 15% for Zonal / Unit activities.. such as Parents / Teachers / Children's / Senior Citizen's Day celebrations, Zonal or unit annual mass, etc.

20% for Church maintenance and Parish related activities including sending some one for training in catechists, etc. 15% for Parish Reserve Fund - for emergencies.

#### Questions that may arise..

# Q1) Why force people to contribute. Leave it free for people to contribute.

Our emphasis is on the parish as a community where every parishioner makes his/her contribution of talents and resources for the growth of the community. It is our Christian obligation to reach out to our brothers and sisters and help satisfy their needs. The Community Fund encourages parishioners to do what Jesus didcare for the poor, the weak and the helpless.

# Q2) Do not people contribute at other times.. e.g. Sunday Masses and other collections for the Parish ?

The Sunday Mass collection will remain your FREE LOVE OFFERING. You may or may not give (incidentally the 1st and 2nd Sunday collection goes to Archbishop's House for the needs of the Archdiocese - especially the new and needy parishes). The contributions to the other archdiocesan collections are also free i.e Collections for Vianney Sunday, Mission Sunday, Lenten Alms, Hunger and Disease Campaign. On these occasions, one gives out of generosity.

# Q3) Is this a new venture or is there an experience we can go by ?

As of now, a few parishes have already initiated this process. The first initiative was taken by Infant Jesus Church, Dombivli in the year 1992. Other parishes too have tried this out, and met with a lot of success. One of our suburban parishes, for example, with only 46% of its parishioners contributing, was able to collect


more than 25 lakhs last year. The parish is therby able to cater not only to its own needs but also to the needs of other parishes.

We like to insist that no one is forced. Much less is there a question of anyone being denied the Sacraments or Christian Burial because he/she has not contributed to the Community Fund. It is not a question of a person being forced: rather it is a self-obligation flowing from a person's realisation of belonging to a Community. When all the parishioners take the Community Fund seriously, it will be a blessing for the parish community and we may add to the contributor. We remember the words of Paul: Thin sowing means thin reaping. If we sow bountifully, we will reap in abundance. (2Cor.9.0). Indeed, the Lord has given us that beautiful promise. "Give and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed own, shaken together, running over will be put into your lap, for the measure you give will be the measure you get back (Lk.6:38)

#### Kindly note ....

For Medical: Bills will be paid only for those who admit in Government Hospitals and NOT expensive Hospitals where the bills are steep. This is as per instructions from the Health commission headed by Bshp Allwyn D'silva For Education: Bills from aided schools only, Only Tuition fees and not for Karate Classes, Music classes, etc., SOP for Co-ordinators for Medical / Educational Aid

- 1. The aid is given to the poor and needy of the parish.
- 2. Application Form available in the Church office to be filled by the Applicant mentioning aid for Medical or Education. Education aid from X Std to 3rd year college in any stream. For further professional studies, case-wise, aid will be given by the Parish Priest,
- 3. Applicant must mention reason for Aid from CWF
- 4. Original bills with admission fees from college for education aid and discharge certificate with medical bills of hospitalisation must be submitted with the application form
- 5. The application form must be given to the respective coordinator who has to personally verify the details mentioned in the application form and state / recommend the same in consultation with other animators in their monthly unit meetings
- The form then must be submitted back to the church office which will be handed over to the Spiritual Head of CWF.
- The CWF committee meets on second Saturdays of every month. The applicant is also called for this meeting. The application will be verified / scrutinised by the CWF team. Applicant is informed on the spot, amount being sanctioned.
- B. For Education: 75% of the fee is sanctioned.
- For Medical: Based on the bills maximum Rs. 40,000/is sanctioned. Incase the amount is more, they can meet the Parish Priest.

### **FUNERAL PROTOCOL**

- 1. When you lose a loved one, you are requested to inform the priest on duty and fix with him the date and timing of the Funeral. This has to be done with the priest and not the undertaker or the Office clerk. Timings for funerals on weekdays is 10.30 am or 4.30 pm. Sundays: only at 11.30 am.
- 2. The SCC animator should also be informed and arrangements should be made to announce in the Church and via Whats app.
- 3. You have to inform the priest whether you want the priest to come home or bring the body IN FRONT OF the church for viewing and condolences for 15 to 20 mins. Most people prefer the 2nd option, as it is more convenient and less time consuming.
- 4. Condolences will not be allowed in the Church.

- Soon after the final commendation, the coffin will be moved to the hearse accompanied by the family. Those who wish to condole may do so at the time of the viewing before Mass or at home if the body is kept there. PLEASE DO NOT DELAY THE FAMILY FROM REACHING THE CEMETERY, AS IT CLOSES AT 6.00 PM.
- 5. There should be NO assembly in front of the Chapel. Lest you disturb those who are praying there
- 6. EULOGIES will be restricted to one person only. And it should not take more than 8 mins.
