Ms. Sultan explained in detail the need to compost wet waste, the different kinds of vegetable, fruit and other kitchen items of waste that can be segregated and composted. She also briefed on the alternate material that can be used as mixture to absorb moisture so that the compost is dry and can be used as instant manure.



I love social media. sometimes a bit too much. sometimes not at all. when I'm on a high, I can post 4-5 times a day. more than that as well - random stuff, a music track I'm listening to on youtube, an artist I really like, a comic strip that just caught my fancy or even repost an interesting news story. I generally avoid political stuff, even in my manic state I find it tasteless.

Why am I telling you this?

because i believe that families need to share. and I've been a part of the good shepherd church family for the last 18 years!

Priya-Ann and I have raised 2 beautiful kids here. we don't wish to move anywhere else (unless that place is called GOA with copious amounts of feni and chorizo)

I sat down to write the script for a voice over demo called Being Bipolar on 20th May (after casting my vote at the recent



elections) and it has been the MOST liberating thing I have ever done!

Coming out of the "Mental closet" has helped me speak more freely about mental health and introspect on how I can be more mindful about my care givers and the stress I sometimes cause them. I'm still very far from achieving a balance, but it will be 6 months+ since my last "episode" and I credit the efforts of my doctor (Rajan Prabhu) and wife (Priya-Ann) for that.

If you are also dealing with any kind of mental strife, my best advice is to speak with a "trained" counsellor. You may have to PAY for the session but it's totally worth it. We don't give enough importance to self care. Priests can only do so much. They are human beings as well and susceptible to human frailty. I am not discounting their abilities for a second. I have called on Fr Anil and Fr Frankie more than once

> for their advice, but one needs to sometimes combine talk therapy with chemical intervention. Science has progressed greatly, we can delve into the same in future posts. Goodbye Daddy and Thankyou


1st September 2024 On his 2nd Death Anniversary...

Dust to dust, I hope to meet you! When my time runs out here...


